ADMISSION

ISU welcomes all students who provide evidence of suitable preparation for college-level study. It is important to note that acceptance to the university does NOT mean acceptance into the student's major program. Many departments have admission requirements that must be met prior to formal acceptance into the declared major. Upon admission to ISU, students receive a coupon for a complimentary CATALOG that may be exchanged at the ISU Bookstore in the Pond Student Union Building (or at the ISU Centers in Idaho Falls, Boise or Twin Falls). Acceptance for all degree-seeking, academic undergraduate students is contingent upon completion of all admission requirements prior to enrollment. The Application for Admission, all supporting documents, and a \$40 non-refundable application fee must be received in the Office of Admissions by August 1 for fall semester and December 1 for spring semester. Students wanting to attend the College of Technology (921 S. 8th Avenue, Stop 8380 (208) 282-2622) should send their admission and application materials to the Student Services Office. Graduate students may contact the Graduate School (921 S. 8th Avenue, Stop 8075, (208) 282-2150) for admissions information.

ADMISSION *(continued)*

Students must notify the Admissions Office (208) 282-2475 of address changes that occur after submission of application.

FINANCIAL AID

Students should complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) as soon as possible. This form is used to request financial assistance in the form of grants, loans, and work-study. ISU encourages all students to apply for federal aid. The forms may be completed at www.fafsa.ed.gov and ISU's institutional code is 001620.

SCHOLARSHIPS

The Application for Admission also serves as the Application for New and Transfer Scholarships. It is important that the application for admission, the \$40 application fee, official high school transcript and/or college transcript, and test scores be sent to the ISU Admissions Office by the **February 15th deadline**.

SCHOLARSHIPS *(continued)*

Students should submit a resume or complete the "Activities Information" on the application supplement identifying leadership and talent accomplishments.

ACADEMIC ADVISING

The Mandatory Advising program is required for degree-seeking, undergraduate students during the first semester of attendance at ISU. This includes all new freshmen, transfer and international students. New freshmen must complete two semesters of Mandatory Advising or complete the on-line option at www.isu.edu/advising/nosearch/firstacadadvis.shtml. Mandatory Advising applies to all international students, including international graduate students. International students are required to attend an orientation to the university. Mandatory Advising at ISU is not intended to replace college or faculty advising. Students must meet with a representative from the Academic Advising Center (AAC) for this purpose (208) 282-3277.
