The purpose of this bill is to foster academic and professional development among ISU students by increasing representation within student government and individual colleges. We have seen a large amount of involvement from the colleges with two senators.

Section 10-Reapportionment-Senator Apportionment

The ASISU Senate's Rules and Appointments Committee shall reapportion the ASISU Senate every third year in the fall on the basis of full-time enrollment counting part-time enrollment at a 3:1 ratio (three (3) part-time students equal one (1) full-time student).

The School of Graduate Studies, the College of Business, the College of Education, the College of Health Professions, the College of Arts and Letters, and the College of Science and Engineering shall be allocated two Senators. The three largest undergraduate colleges shall each receive two Senators, and The College of Pharmacy and the College of Technology remaining colleges shall each receive one Senator. Fall enrollment numbers should be used for the spring elections of every academic year The reapportionment will be presented to the Senate in the form of a resolution for a majority vote of approval.
