

Program participants pursue graduate study, conduct research, or teach English abroad.

Interested and qualified students will need to determine what they wish to do abroadresearch or study (or a combination of these), or teaching English as a second language-then decide which country they would like to target, and why. Undergraduates who will be seniors next year, those interested in starting graduate study, and graduate students wishing to conduct research are all welcome to apply, as are those interested in teaching English. 
