

Professor Gershberg Publishes Book

Addressing contemporary concerns about democracy, partisan politics and misinformation by examining other periods of cultural disruption, Idaho State University associate professor of journalism Zac Gershberg coauthored a timely new book out this summer from the University of Chicago Press, *The Paradox of Democracy: Free Speech, Open Media, and Perilous Persuasion.*

A sweeping overview of communications technologies and their impact on public discourse, Gershberg wrote with Sean Illing, of Vox, to consider how free expression has facilitated democracy so citizens can mobilize and use their voices. Yet they also chart the degree to which such openness enables forces of exploitation and propaganda that seek to undermine democracy from within.

"The Paradox of Democracy is as provocative as it is unpredictable," wrote *Washington Post* media columnist Margaret Sullivan. "It carefully and engagingly expands our understanding of how democracy works—and struggles—in a society where free expression is foundational and where media is undergoing revolutionary and rapid change."

According to Dr. Mark McBeth, ISU Chair and professor of Political Science, ISU was one of the first universities in the United States to adopt the D.A. degree option and the program has been training and placing students for 51 years.

Students Graduate High School with ISU Associates Degrees and Certificates

According to Chelsie Rauh, Director of the Early College Program, 147 Associate Degrees of Art were conferred through June and through August to high school graduates.

Holly Kartchner, Director of Outreach and Retention in the College of Arts and Letters, says that more students are taking advantage of dual credit and collegeprovided courses. With Fast Forward funding, college credits can be paid for by the state. By the time they graduate, it's possible for high school students to have completed two of their four years of college.

"Every student gets individualized advising so students can be strategic as they work through their associates program," Kartchner says.

Along with Associates of Arts degrees being conferred, 37 students received their Spanish Language Basic Certificate, and one student received a German Language Basic Certificate.


