

Communication, Media and Persuasion, has been awarded a Senior Research Fellowship (2023-2025) by the <u>American Institute of Indian Studies</u> (AIIS) to carry out research for her book titled, "Online hatred, abuse, and women journalists in the era of digitalization in India: Opportunities and Challenges."

The book will include women journalists' in-depth interviews, survey responses, and an analysis of their social media posts.

Faculty Member Book Publication


New faculty member in the Department of Global Studies and Languages, José Eduardo Villalobos Graillet, has published the book, "La Celestina" and film: censorship and reception.
