TEACHING EXPERIENCE

Idaho State University, 2013-present

ART 2210/CMP 2250, **History and Appreciation of Photography—Online** (SP15, FA15, SP16, FA16, SP17, FA18, SP19): Not only will this course investigate photography as a technological impact on social culture, it will examine the broader role of photography within visual culture. Thus, we will explore the history of photography from its beginnings during the 1820s up to and including mid-20th century photographic issues that address postmodernism. This course satisfies Goal 4 of the General Education requirements.

ART 2210/CMP 2250, **History and Appreciation of Photography** (FA13, SP14, FA14): NOTE: *This was a real-time televised distance-learning course that is broadcast to satellite ISU campuses. Currently it is only offered online.* Not only will this course investigate photography as a technological impact on social culture, it will examine the broader role of photography within visual culture. Thus, we will explore the history of photography from its beginnings during the 1820s up to and including mid-20th century photographic issues that address postmodernism. This course satisfies Goal 4 of the General Education requirements.

CMP 2251, **Introduction to Photography** (SU14, SU15, SP17[Hybrid], FA18): Introduction of essential aesthetic and technical principles as applied to photography. Basic digital camera operation, basic digital image processing and output, and basic image design and composition are covered. Students must own a digital camera to enroll (this does **NOT** include phone cameras). An additional fee is associated with this course. 3 credits, no prerequisites.

CMP 3352, **Photographic Communication** (FA13, FA14, FA15, FA16, FA17, FA18): The purpose of this course is to explore the specific techniques for communicative photography. Additionally, this course will address the fundamentals of image making as it relates to mass media communications: such as advertising, editorial/magazine, photojournalism, or corporate photo communication. On a broader scale, this course should make the student aware of the personal commitment to and the ethical obligations required for being a good visual communicator.

CMP 3355, **Studio Photography** (SP16, FA17, SP19): This class will provide an experience in directed photographic visual communication in the studio environment. Students will gain an understanding of the studio setting through applied theory. Additionally, students will concentrate on problem solving skills and complete a variety of assignments that are designed to challenge their skills in lighting, camera operation, and visual interpretation.

CMP 4455, **Photo Media** (SP14, SP15, SP16): Effective use of photography to communicate within Digital Media. Photo Media is the art of visually communicating a news or feature story with still pictures or video. It requires a photographer to adapt as situations arise in order to cover a story as it unfolds without becoming part of the story. The goal is to help you learn to see the story and communicate it through photographs within the multimedia formats expected within today's social and mass media environments.

CMP 4457, **Advanced Photo Media** (FA13, FA14, FA15, FA16): The purpose of this course is to explore the notion of concepts as they relate to visual storytelling for multi-media/multi-platform productions. We will investigate the idea of the photographer's *intent* in regards to crafting color and B&W images into a visual story. Further, we will examine the elements and decisions required for storytelling, along with appropriate concept research techniques. Additionally, each student will create a body of cohesive images suitable for professional multi-platform distribution in the form of a book publication, multi-media production (audio, video, and/or still images for the Web), or a traditional art exhibit.

CMP 6630, **Graduate Seminar: Understanding the Visual** (SP15, SP17, SP19): Beginning in the early 20th century, visual images (both still and moving) began to impact American and European cultures. Today in the 21st century, visual images of all types are the ubiquitous norm of our society and have contributed to what's called *visual culture*. Thus, visual culture and images range from professional media photographs to *Instagram* and the ever-present *selfies* posted on social media; family *snapshots*; televised movies, news, and advertisements; new media usage including digital video gaming; even the physical environment (visual ecology) from museum sites to national monuments.

As such, a primary focus of this class will be investigating visual methodologies for "reading" the visual (and text) within our visually dominated culture. We will critically explore a variety of images from the media, corporate identity, snapshots, fine art, and the environment, and means of interpretation through areas such as: audience studies, compositional interpretation, semiology, ethnography, and discourse analysis, among others, in order to understand overarching ideologies affecting public memory and, social- and self-identity construction.

PHOT 1203, **Introduction to Photography** (FA12): Introduction of essential aesthetic and technical principles as applied to photographic communication. Basic digital camera operation, basic digital image processing and output, and basic image design and composition are covered. Students must own a digital camera to enroll. Not for Photo majors or minors.

PHOT 2210, **Studio Photography** (FA07, SP08, SS08, FA08, SP09, FA09, SP10, FA10, SP11, FA11, SP12, FA12, SP13): Studio experiences involving: lighting, visual perception, environment, historical studio genres, aesthetics, and theory.

PHOT 3215, **History of Photography** (SP12, SP13): This course surveys the social and technological developments of photography's beginning to contemporary imaging styles, photographers, and systems. Course includes discussions, written assignments, and critiques concerning the comparative analysis of various periods, schools, and particular individuals and their contributions to the art and science of photography. Not only will this course investigate photography as a technological impact on social culture, it will examine the broader role of photography within visual culture. Thus, we will explore the history of photography from its beginnings during the 1820s up to and including mid-20th century photographic issues that address the *postmodernistic turn*.

PHOT 3230, **Digital Imaging** (SS08, FA08, FA09): An introduction to current digital image editing methods, providing the photographer with the fundamental skills and knowledge needed to process their images. Instruction includes image correction, enhancement, and manipulation. Digital imaging is explored as a method for both improving imagery and as a sophisticated creative tool.

PHOT 3280, **Advanced Studio Photography** (SP07, FA07, SP08, FA08, SP09, FA09, SP10, FA10, SP11, FA11, SP12, FA12, SP13): Advanced investigation into photographic theory within the studio environment: including visual analytical problem solving, visual semiotics, aesthetics, criticism, and applied theory in lighting and set design.

PHOT 4230, **Business Management for Photographers** (FA10, FA11, FA12): To explore the reality of owning and/or running a successful photographic business built on strong management principles, ethical standards, and other professional practices. Student assignments, reading materials, and group discussions will focus on producing individual business plans and supportive material for their photography specialty area.

PHOT 4252, **Portfolio** (FA06, SP07, FA07, SP08, FA08, SP09, FA09, SP10, FA10, SP11, FA11): This is a capstone class and culminating experience in the photography program, providing for the creation and production of a portfolio that reflects the photographer's personal career goals.

PHOT 4260, **Photography, Advertising, and Society** (FA06, SP08, SP09, SP10, SP11, SP12, SP13). This is an exploration of the use, context, and meaning of photography within advertising, mass media, and society. In addition to creating images, students will investigate how images in mass media and advertising are used and consumed by society.

COMM 2530, **Photojournalism** (FA12): Photojournalism is the art of visually telling a news or feature story with still pictures or video. It requires a photographer to adapt as situations arise in order to cover a story as it unfolds *without* becoming part of the story. It can be frustrating, yet exhilarating. The goal is to help you learn to see the story and communicate it through photographs. Effective use of photography to communicate in the digital media.
