PROGRAM EXPECTATIONS

As part of the PaCT program, students are expected to:

- Apply for FAFSA <u>each</u> year (see page 3)
- Be continuously enrolled throughout the school year (fall, spring, & summer)
- Cover the cost of books, praxis exams, and any course retakes
- Complete the program within 6 years (16 semesters)
- Remain employed as a paraprofessional with their school district during the program
- Maintain a 3.0 cumulative GPA (see page 7 for helpful study tips!)

APPLYING FOR FAFSA

What is the FAFSA?

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is an application for federal student aid, including federal grants for schooling.



When to Apply

The FAFSA opens **October 1st** and closes **June 30th** each year.

Students must apply every year!


How do I register for courses?

Course registration is completed on MyISU. Instructions for course registration can be found <u>here</u>.

You will need to <u>download Duo Mobile</u>, a two-factor identification system, to access MyISU.

What if a class I need is full?

If a class is full, you can register for the waitlist by clicking "add to waitlist" using the dropdown menu. Don't forget to press "submit"!





Where can I find course materials?

Can I rent my books?

You are welcome to rent your books. If you rent a book and decide you would like to keep it, there is often an option to purchase it at the end of the semester.

Note: While the university bookstore will provide you with the necessary materials for your courses, you are free to search the internet for deals on books.

ISU BOOK BUNDLE

What is the ISU Book Bundle?

After registering for classes, the bookstore will <u>automatically</u> prepare rentals of your course material for pickup or delivery for a flat rate of **\$24.7 per credit hour**, as opposed to renting each book separately.

If you would like to opt out of the ISU book bundle, you can do so on MyISU, linked <u>here.</u>


HELPFUL STUDY TIPS
