CLINICAL REHABILITATION COUNSELING LEADING TO THE DEGREE MASTER OF COUNSELING (M.COUN.)

The master's specialty practice area in Clinical Rehabilitation Counseling is designed to prepare counselors to provide individual and group counseling in a variety of settings such as vocational rehabilitation (Idaho Division of Vocational Rehabilitation, Commission for the Blind and Visually Impaired), certified rehabilitation providers like Community Partnership Of Idaho, various mental health agencies, the Veterans Administration, disability student services with various academic institutions, integrated behavioral health, nonprofits, and private practice.

A. General Residency Requirement. For the Master of Counseling (M.COUN.) specialty practice area, the student is required to complete the equivalent of at least four full semesters of resident graduate study beyond the bachelor's degree. The minimum Clinical Rehabilitation Counseling program must total 60 semester hours.
