ISU Doctoral Program in Clinical Psychology Professional Training Opportunities

ISU Psychology Clinic

The ISU Psychology Clinic is housed in Garrison Hall on ISU's campus and provides psychological testing and evidence-based psychotherapy for children, adolescents, adults, couples, and families. The Psychology Clinic is a training and behavioral health care center connected with the ISU Psychology Department. This treatment facility was established in 1978 and provides training for doctoral students in the clinical psychology program as well as a low-cost treatment option for Southeastern Idahoans.

Epilepsy Foundation of Idaho, Camp Hope

Camp Hope is a medical summer camp held in Hidden Paradise, Idaho. This camp is focused on helping kids with epilepsy build psychosocial skills and strength through interacting with other kids with epilepsy and trained camp counselors/clinicians.

Forensic Practice

Students partner with a licensed clinical psychologist in private practice assessing adults and juveniles involved in legal proceedings in both the community and in local jails.

Health West ISU Community Health Center

Health West ISU Community Health Center is a family medicine residency clinic providing primary medical care, including full psychological services, to a diverse population of individuals.

Idaho Health & Welfare Infant-Toddler Program

Multidisciplinary team that provides consultation and recommendations for children and families with a child between 0–3 years of age with a developmental delay, disability, or condition that puts them at risk for a delay.

ISU Counseling and Mental Health Center

University Counseling and Mental Health Center (CMHC) provides free individual, group, biofeedback, and crisis counseling to ISU students for any concerns, including mood and anxiety disorders, interpersonal concerns, coping with stress, academic concerns, eating disorders, and traumatic events in childhood and adult life.

Life Change Associates

Life Change Associates is an interdisciplinary mental health care setting with a psychiatrist, nurse practitioner, four PAs, and four licensed mental health treatment providers. Patients are primarily adults, including geriatric populations and some adolescents, who receive individual and group psychotherapy treatments. Psychotherapy includes several evidence-based therapeutic approaches. Biological therapies include diagnostic evaluations and medication management for all types of mental health and substance use disorders, as well as transcranial magnetic stimulation (TMS) and ketamine-assisted- psychotherapy.

Pearl Health Clinic

Pearl Health Clinic is a large multidisciplinary outpatient community mental health clinic serving all ages and presenting problems. Services provided include clinical interviews, outpatient psychotherapy, medication management, and neuropsychological and psychological testing.

Portneuf Medical Center Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU)

The PMC NICU is staffed by board-certified neonatologists who care for both well and very critically ill newborns. Clinical psychology students at this site provide psychosocial support, counseling, and guidance for parents and staff in the NICU.

Prosper Development Disability Agency

Prosper DDA is a developmental disability agency that provides behavioral intervention services to children in the foster care system and who reside in a children's residential facility. Children served by the DDA have a variety of diagnoses and behavioral health concerns, such as trauma, emotional dysregulation, and/or intellectual and developmental disabilities (specifically ASD).

Psychological Assessment Specialists

Psychological Assessment Specialists is a comprehensive community mental health agency in Pocatello that offers adolescent and adult therapy and can include youth and adult treatment models, depending on referral needs and extern interests. This position is for advanced students who would like to develop their clinical interests and get exposure to work in a private practice setting.

School-based Mental Health

Students partner with a licensed clinical psychologist associated with the <u>ISU College of Education</u> and engage in a variety of school-based mental health prevention, intervention, and consultation services in support of students, teachers, staff, and administrators in Pocatello/Chubbuck School District 25.

State Hospital South

State Hospital South provides psychiatric inpatient treatment and skilled nursing care for Idaho's adult and adolescent citizens with the most serious and persistent mental illnesses.

St. Luke's Health System, Magic Valley

The Magic Valley behavior health team at St. Luke's Health System (in Twin Falls, ID) is a multidisciplinary team that provides a range of psychiatric and psychological treatment to patients across the age and diagnostic spectrum.
