



Are You Registered To Vote?

Your vote matters!

Election day is Tuesday, November 5, 2024 and the results are guaranteed to have an impact on your future.

This is the first of a non-partisan informative series on voting in the upcoming 2024 general election.



You may feel that choosing a president or a senator just isn't something that affects your life right now, but in four years....where will you be and what will you be doing?

Will you have college debt and be looking for a job with retirement and health insurance benefits? Will you be starting your own business and paying your own health insurance? Will you be married, buying a house, and having children?

While you can't predict who or where you'll be in four years, you can be sure that the political officials elected into office and the policies they implement will impact your life in the coming months and years.

Why not have a say? The first step to make a choice, speak up, and take part in the election to protect your interests in your first few years in the "real world" is to register to vote.

VOTE.GOV has everything you need to know about registering to vote. You can

- check to see if you are already registered
- find out more about voting as a college student and making the decision to be registered in your hometown or Pocatello.

If you're an Idaho resident, you can register online (deadline is Friday, October 11).

If you're not an official Idaho resident, you can enter your home state and find all the details you need to know about registering.

Voting by mail (absentee and early voting) may be an option for you. State laws and deadlines vary greatly, so check to see if it's available in your home state.


