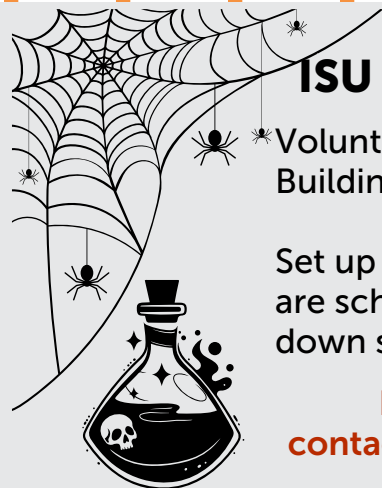


ISU Physics' Haunted Science Laboratory Needs Volunteers

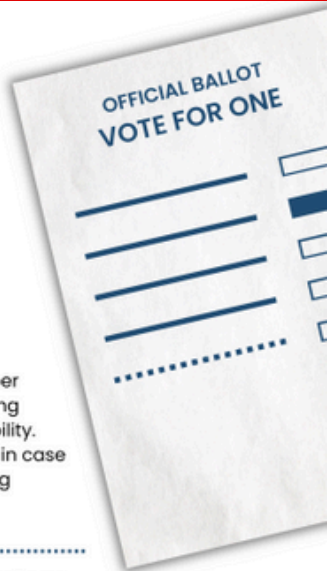

Making Elections Secure

Your vote is your voice, and we're committed to ensuring that your voice is heard loud and clear while maintaining the highest standards of security and transparency. This guide breaks down some of the robust measures in place to protect the integrity of our electoral process and how you can play a vital role in upholding the democratic values we hold dear.



Voter Identity

Secure photo identification or a personal identification affidavit is required to vote. To register, voters must also provide proof of residence at their current address.

Equipment Testing

Idaho's election equipment undergoes federal, state, and local testing, and certification by the Secretary of State, ensuring reliable and secure voting equipment.

Post-Election Audits

Primary and General elections are subject to thorough audits, monitored by independent bodies, including election officials and political party representatives, to ensure compliance and transparency.



Paper Ballot Transparency

All Idaho counties use paper ballots for voting, enhancing transparency and traceability. Paper trails allow auditing in case of discrepancies, bolstering election security.

Statewide Voter System & Roll Maintenance

Idaho's State Voter Registration System is used statewide and works in real-time to capture voter activity and guard against attempts to vote multiple times. The Idaho voter roll is actively maintained to ensure the list is current and correct.
