# **2024 General Election | Tuesday, November 5th**The last day to vote is one week away!

#### If you voted early, Be proud, you've done civic duty!

Now relax and wait for the results.

If waiting makes you anxious, <u>encourage others to vote!</u>

#### If you're undecided on a race or measure, Learn more!

If you're choosing between candidates —
Go to candidates websites to learn more about their stance on issues.
Read transcripts of what they say in a speech or interview.

If you're not sure about what to vote on a ballot measure (e.g., proposition or amendment, bond), read pro and con opinion pieces from credible sources. Ask questions. Think about the long term consequences of the measure or how it will affect others. Does it make improvements for the greater good or the general public?

## If you haven't voted and Bannock County (1B) is your official residence, You've got options.

The deadline for <u>early voting</u> is Friday, November 1.

You can cast your vote at the
Bannock County Elections Office
141 N 6th Ave, Pocatello | 8:30 am – 4:30 pm
(Note: The building is under construction. Enter the building using the ADA entrance in the parking lot behind the building. There is also a Ballot Drop-Box at that entrance, if needed.)

You can <u>register to vote at the polling station</u> on Tuesday, November 5th and <u>vote right after you register</u>. Bring <u>photo ID</u>, <u>proof of residence</u>, and your <u>sample ballot</u>!

## If you haven't voted and you're not 1B, you must find the deadlines for your place of official residence.

#### If you're concerned about election integrity, Learn more!

The election process is designed to be transparent and nonpartisan. State and local election offices take steps to make sure elections are secure and accurate.

Start to learn about the election process at <a href="vote.gov">vote.gov</a> and your state election website (eg, <a href="voteidaho.gov">voteidaho.gov</a>)

Remember, your local poll workers are local citizens. They're retirees, veterans, and people who come from across all walks of life. They're dedicated to ensuring fair and free elections.

#### If you abstain from voting, It's ok, but accept the results.

Voting is not mandated or compulsory; non-participation is a personal choice. A single vote may not make a difference, but in an election, many single votes can form the majority.
