2024 General Election | Tuesday, November 5th Where to Vote on Tuesday?

If you live in your official residence and plan to vote tomorrow, make sure you know where to vote. Different precincts have different voting locations.

Go to voteidaho.gov to find your polling place.

Can I Register to Vote at My Polling Place on Tuesday?

YES, if you're registered in Idaho and live locally, you can <u>register to</u> <u>vote at the polling station</u> on Tuesday, November 5th and vote right after you register. Bring <u>photo ID</u>, <u>proof of residence</u>, and your <u>sample ballot</u>!

When Will We Know Who Won?

It depends on the race and place.

Counting mail-in ballots, close races, and legal challenges could delay reporting results for days to weeks. Multiple scenarios are possible, from the local to national levels.

Counting mail-in ballots takes more time, especially if mail-in ballots can't be counted until election day. Some states allow ballots to be counted before election day, some don't.

Close races need more ballots counted before making a call. It's a relatively simple math problem: For example, if Candidate A is leading by 40,000 votes and there are only 15,000 votes left to count, Candidate A can be declared the winner. Even if Candidate B took all 15,000 votes, it's not enough for Candidate B to win.

There are multiple places to keep track of the election results. AP News has a website for all results with links to individual state results. Idaho election results at voteidaho.gov and Bannock County website.



Feeling Election Anxiety?

Election day is tomorrow and for many Americans it is coming with a side order of anxiety. If you are feeling election day anxiety, you're in good company! A poll by the American Psychiatric Association from August of 2024 found that 77% of Americans, said "the future of the nation is a significant source of stress in their lives," which is a sentiment shared (within a 4% margin) equally between Republicans, Independents, and Democrats (NBC, Nov. 2, 2024). So how do we cope with all that worry?

First, experts recommend a simple exercise that people can do anywhere. Take a deep breath, then pick one of the five senses and focus on stimuli you are receiving from that sense while practicing mindful breathing. Second, limit your consumption of negative news, and third, take your civil discourse offline and engage face-to-face with the intent to listen to other perspectives - even when you don't agree (Forbes, Oct. 2024).

And last, though arguably the most important, embrace the truth - we are not as divided as we perceive. The <u>Voice of the People</u>, a nonpartisan organization through the School of Public Policy at the University of Maryland identified <u>200+policy issues</u>, that across the political parties, a majority of the American people see eye-to-eye on.

No matter the outcome of the election, we can ease our own anxiety by choosing humanity over fear. Let's put our shared humanity above politics, value empathy and kindness first and foremost, and resolve to see ourselves in every person we interact with and engage with them accordingly.
