- 4. Proposal #45 from COSE Mechanical Engineering to remove ECE 2250 from the BS and Accelerated BS in Mechanical Engineering curriculum, and modify ME 4406 to 2 credits. Changes affect Proposal #31 forthcoming from Electrical & Computer Engineering. Requires Letter of Notification notifying OSBE, and NWCCU approval of the curricular and credit changes.
